SC PASS	Given to all students in Grades 4-8. Students in grades 4, 6, and 8 will take a Science assessment. Students in Grades 5 and 7 will take a Social Studies Assessment.	Testing will occur in May at various sites throughout the state. There will be 1 day of testing for SC PASS.

Ready to Work – Career Readiness Assessment	Required of all students in their 3rd year of high school. The exam measures a student's career readiness in four areas: Math, Reading, Locating Information, and Soft Skills.	Testing will take place in April at various locations throughout the state.
End of Course Examination	EOC exams are for any student taking certain high school courses (English 2, Algebra 1, Continuing Algebra, Biology, US History). The exam counts as 20% of the student's final grade in the course.	Testing will occur in May at various sites throughout the state.
