#### School Board Meeting March 27, 2023 Principal's Report

- \*Enrollment is currently at 806 students. We still have a waiting list for all grade levels.
- \*Lunch and learns have concluded. We had over 450 parents visiting this past year.
- \*Construction is still going well for our new classrooms and office/conference room. Anticipation is still set for August 1.
- \*We announced last week that we will begin 6<sup>th</sup> grade next year. Lottery applications went online today and will be collected for 2 weeks. We anticipate a live lottery in a few weeks.
- \*The deadline for returning students letters of intent was a few weeks ago. We did have some current students missed the deadline and the waitlist has been utilized since that deadline.
- \*We currently have the largest capacity gymnasium among all SC Public Charter Schools in SC.
- \*Gray received FULL APPROVAL to be named a USC site beginning in July 2023. This is a wonderful opportunity for our school and Gray families.
- \*Career and Technology Education: Gray will have its first class of CTE Completers this year. We have added an additional course to the series so the students can become completers. In the future, due to the addition of Ms. Keim we will be able to add a completer path for Sports Medicine.
