School Board Meeting January 23, 2023 Principal's Report

- *Enrollment is currently at 806 students. We still have a waiting list for all grade levels.
- *Lunch and learns have started again. We are close to being full again for next school year.

EXCELLENT Report Card Rating

- *One of only 4 High Schools in our surrounding districts (Lex 1-5, Richland 1 & 2). The other schools were 4A and 5A High Schools.
- *Construction is still going well. We have opened the new gym and the new benchmark will be soccer. We are hopeful to have it approved by Feb 8.
- *We currently have the largest capacity gymnasium among all SC Public Charter Schools in SC.
- *I submitted 4 proposals for changes with the SCHSL.
- *Teacher Certification: In an effort to decrease the number of uncertified teachers we have numerous teachers enrolled in the Teachers of Tomorrow program. They will gain their initial certification during the 22-23 school year.
- *Career and Technology Education: Gray will have its first class of CTE Completers this year. We have added an additional course to the series so the students can become completers. In the future, due to the addition of Ms. Keim we will be able to add a completer path for Sports Medicine.

2023-2024 Local Board Approved Classes

- 1) **Gray Integration**-A course designed specifically to help introduce our 8th grade students to our academic expectations and school culture here at Gray Collegiate Academy.
- BIO 101 Lab- Introduction survey of macromolecules, cell structure and function, genetics, and molecular biology.
- 3) American Studies- Focuses on US History from the Reconstruction Period to the present.
- 4) Anatomy & Physiology Lab- First part of a 2-part laboratory sequence covering Human Anatomy and Physiology. The students learn the principles of human anatomy and physiology, which are demonstrated by microscopic studies, animal dissection, and physiological experiments.
- 5) Yearbook Production 2-4- We want to produce our own yearbook and provide opportunity for the students to participate and earn a High School credit.
- 6) **Physical Education 5-8** The emphasis in this course is on muscular strength, endurance, flexibility, and safety.
