2. Mission Statement read by Teresa Brazell

Gray Collegiate Academy will serve high school students in a safe, small, family-centered setting who week the opportunity and challenge of a rigorous curriculum, high academic stands and outstanding athletics while earning up to two years of college credit while in high school.

3. Adoption of Agenda

Wayne McKim made the motion to adopt the agenda. Andy Markl seconded the motion. All in favor.

4. Special Meeting to discuss the Bond

Brandon Lewisohn discussed the documents of the refinance of the GCA property. Black Rock through BB&T is the interested investors. The board had several questions concerning the loan and stipulations tied to the loan. Brandon Lewisohn, Emily Luther and Bert Newsome answered the board's questions. After discussion of the bond contract, Wayne McKim made a motion of adopt the resolution for Teresa Brazell to sign the bond contracts. It was seconded by Andy Markl. All in favor.

The board discussed with Eric Miller, Todd Helms, Mike Miller and Mike D'Angelo the urgency for the gym construction project and adding an 8th grade. The board expressed that they would like to see this open in August, 2021. Pinnacle stated they are starting this process. The board would like to have updates at all of our scheduled meetings.

5. Adjournment

Andy Markl made a motion to adjourn at 10:30 am. It was seconded by Wayne McKim. All in favor.

DECEMBER 2019 FINANCIAL SUMMARY

1. Revenue totaled \$472,000 for the month of December. This compares to budgeted revenue of \$435,000 or \$37,000 over budget. However, revenue from the State continues to fall short of budget (consistent with prior months this fiscal year). Budgeted revenue from the State is based on enrollment of 500 students. We have been short of budget during the first semester because we are being paid based on 475 students. This will be adjusted at the end of January when we begin receiving payments from our 45 day count enrollment

Total revenue for December was over budget because of higher fee income for the month. In addition, we received \$34,000 from bond proceeds that reimbursed the school for legal fees that we previously paid prior to bond closing. (Professional services expense is over budget because of this expenditure)

- 2. Year to date our revenues are \$90,000 under budget with the shortfall in State funding offset by higher than budgeted user fees and bond income.
- 3. Expenses for December totaled \$419,000. This compares to total budgeted expenses of \$406,000 or \$13,000 over budget. We were over budget for the month primarily because bonuses were paid to staff totaling \$49,500. This higher expense was offset by lower payments on our building in the amount of \$10,331. Through November 2019 we were paying rent on the building in the amount of \$61,813 per month. Following the purchase of the building, our monthly payment on the bond is \$51,483. On a year-to-date basis we are \$18,000 under budget on expenses.
- 4. The school had a profit for the month of \$53,000. This is \$24,000 over our budgeted profit of \$29,000. Through December, our profit is

\$103,000 compared to a budgeted profit of \$175,000. School profit will begin to trend higher than budget for the second semester when our new funding amount is received.

5. Operating cash balances increased by \$82,000 since last month due profits for the month and timing of cash payments. The operating cash balance was \$1,012,000 as of January 15, 2020. This represents 84 days of cash on hand. Our cash balance is significantly higher than the same period last year due to payments on large capital improvement projects in 2018.

Proposed Scope of Work

- In recent months Pinnacle staff and General Contractors discussed potential layouts that could optimize items requested by the Board, physically, logistically, and financially.
- The layout most consistently suggested involves:
- 1) Construction of a new gym in front of the existing school, just set off Leaphart Rd.
- 2) About 30 parking spaces would remain in the front and side of the school, but the rest would be moved to the strip of land where the practice field is today
 - 3) Renovating the existing gym to add 6+/- middle school only classrooms plus common area
- 4) Construction of a multi-purpose turf field on land acquired in 2018.
- The off-site Midlands Sports Complex improvements are unaffected by the layout on Gray's campus
- Note that this is for now a conceptual plan that is the basis of discussion. Modifications may be necessary as the plan moves forward based on feedback from SC DOT, Office of School Facilities, Lexington County, Army Corps of Engineers, financing considerations,



Proposed Scope of Work – Thoughts & Considerations

- Some major items that were taken into consideration with this proposed layout include:
- The property setback/buffer immediately behind the existing gym limits Gray from building a 26,000 square foot gym in that area.
- Approval of each resident impacted behind school needed to overlap buffer (doubtful).
- Costs to build where the existing retention pond is would be considerable.
- Instead, the front of the school has more room and site work/grading is much less expensive and provides good visibility from Leaphart Road.
- The existing gym is roughly the size we need to serve the middle school without overlapping the high school space.
- The existing gym is a pre-engineered steel building, with columns designed to bear weight specifically for the size of the building as it's built. Discussions about possibly bumping out a wall to increase the size of the gym for increased capacity indicated this would be a prohibitively expensive engineering challenge.
- requirements in place, parking is a highest and best use of this space. The logistical impact of the move is generally limited during school hours, but it opens up a lot more area for event parking. The parking area would be moved to the narrow strip of land. With the buffers and setback
- A multipurpose turf field would be added where the narrow strip ends and the land Gray acquired in 2018 begins.

Proposed Location of New Gym

- Operationally, the gym is preferred to be near the school building.
- The next closest point where Gray has enough land to fit the gym is on the expansion land. That is 2,000 linear feet (0.4 miles) from the back of the school building.
- GCs have reported building out front will be less expensive because the utilities are already under ground, and the ground is cleared & compacted.
- Fewer obstacles to clear
- With the gym being the top priority, its placement is a lynchpin for the other improvements.





General Contractor contacts

- This scope of work was discussed with four General Contractors, each of whom have experience with charter schools (and athletic facilities) in South Carolina.
- Bouma Construction
- National builder of charter schools based in Michigan; has vast experience with athletic facilities and high schools in SC and beyond
- Choate Construction
- Regional builder headquartered in Atlanta that has done work for Pinnacle previously
- **Hood Construction**
- Local to Columbia, has ties to Gray based on their familiarity with the construction of the facility originally, as well as install of the modular units
- **Hubrich Contracting**
- Based in Durham, NC; specializes in charter schools in the Carolinas. Completed the renovation of the temporary Legion Collegiate facility and currently building the permanent Legion Collegiate facility



General Contractor – Design-Build approach

- Based on the scope and where Gray is in the process, each of the firms advocated a "design-build" approach to the project
- Why? Greater efficiency, better communication, lower costs
- Design-Build is a turn-key construction process where the GC hires and centrally manages the architect, engineer, due diligence firms, and all subcontractors.
- Upfront costs are not paid by Gray until financing closes
- The GC is hired on the front end when the project is still a concept
- Acts as a partner walking hand-in-hand with a client through each step until completion



General Contractor – Pricing

- Design-Build does not allow a GC to provide a "guaranteed" price initially; that can engineering plans exist, and permits are in hand from state and local agencies. only come once due diligence is complete, a set of architectural and civil
- For the sake of our discussions, Pinnacle did ask each firm to provide pricing based on the scope as we know it to be today.
- Each firm was provided with the same email outlining the scope, as well as the blueprints) to help give them as much information to work from as possible. same attachments (full blueprints of Gray, full Gray site plan, Legion's gym

General Contractor – Sample Timing & Logistics

- Design & Preconstruction starts in March 2020 → 4 months
- Permitting starts in August 2020 \rightarrow 2 months (aggressive based on OSF history)
- New gym Construction starts in November 2020 → 9 months
- July 2021 completion date
- $8^{\rm th}$ Grade Academy renovation starts in spring 2021 \rightarrow 4 months
- August 2021 completion date
- Existing gym would be decommissioned from current use to allow renovation to occur.
- Current plan does not impact café, so that could remain open.
- Multipurpose field would be built and ready by August 2021.
- Midlands Sports Complex can be done on a much shorter timeframe (+/- 1 month)

Recommendations to the Gray Board of Directors

Secure approximately \$2.5MM from a TBD source for the improvements below:

- Renovate Midlands Sports Complex for Fall 2020 season
- Incorporation of an 8^{th} grade academy by adding three (3) 26' \times 60' modular units
 - Fall 2021
- Provides six classrooms
- How/whether we address the retention pond will depend on a proposed layout and Lex-Co input
- Addition of a synthetic turf football/multi-purpose field on school property for Fall 2021
- Pause construction of a new gym pending additional revenue sources and Gray fundraising efforts

Layout Considerations

Legal:

- Setback no structure can be placed within 75' of any property line. Only "accessory items" (e.g. roads) can be placed within even 100'.
- Impact: this limits buildable space behind the gym and narrow strip of land.

Physical:


- property line. Most of this is being used by a parking lot and retention pond. The retention pond area can be reclaimed, but it will be very costly to fill it and locate elsewhere. \$250k+. Available space – Gray has approximately 210' from the back of the current gym to its rear
 - The narrow strip of land is 272' wide. Accounting for the buffer, about 122' of its width can be built on for buildings or fields.
- A modular unit with two classrooms is 26' \times 64'. All three units can be placed collectively together on the existing practice field.



Layout Considerations

- Physical (cont'd):
- At first glance, there appears to be space to fit one (1) of the three perpendicular to the existing modular if the school decided to go in that direction.
- A full-size turf field cannot physically fit on the narrow strip.
- The strip allows for 122' to be built on it but a football field is 160'.
- A full-size field could be built on the land acquired in 2018.
- Most GCs already priced the field in this location and included running some utilities and parking for 30+/-
- The field would be at least 2000' from the back of the main school building.
- Placement consideration with future growth in mind
- How would students/coaches/parents get to a field there?
